






RAI BRITISH CLASSIC WEEK

The bigger boats didn't have it all their way and it was the mallest in the fleet that was third overall, Richard Matthews' 5ft 9in (7.84m) Stella *Scorpio* taking a class victory and an appressive win in the regatta's long course, a 45-mile race in onditions that forced most boats to retire. *Scorpio* (1964) had to Olympic 470 gold medallist Saskia Clark on foredeck.

An international entry of more than 50 yachts this year ncluded a Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron team, racing Fife 6-M felita in a six-strong fleet of 6-Ms.

Aside from the racing, the British Classic Yacht Club put an imphasis on new Concours d'Elégance prizes. Best rofessionally maintained yacht was Michael Briggs' 1904 Fife O Linear Rater *Mikado*, while best owner-kept yacht was 1952 ife sloop *Nyachilwa*, owned by Graham Dallas. The overall oncours winner was *Cuilaun*, a 1969 McGruer ketch owned by rian Smullen for all of her 48 years.
